### Reflection

The saying, "It takes all sorts to make a world", may have appeared sometime in the 1600's, but the Bible anticipated its truth a long time before that. Right from the start the scriptures present a procession of characters extraordinarily different from one another, and by no means paragons of virtue, yet each with a part to play in the saga of God's love affairs with humankind.

Today we hear from one of the most tortured personalities in the whole of the scriptures, the prophet Jeremiah. His unwelcome message of submission to the imperial power of Babylon made him the target not just of vilification but of murderous plots on his life. He does not hesitate to lament his invidious situation and complain loud and long before God.

Could anyone be more different from Jeremiah than Australia's own Mary MacKillop? Her acceptance of the cross and submission to God's will led her to write: "Whatever troubles may be before you, accept them bravely, remembering Whom you are trying to follow. Do not be afraid. Love one another, bear with one another, and let charity guide you all your life. God will reward you as only He can". No Jeremiah-like protest here! So we should say, "It takes all sorts to make the kingdom of God".

## What happens to the money you give to support your Parish and your Diocese?

### COLLECTIONS AT MASS

#### First Collection

- Support of parish clergy including stipend and living expenses.
- Support the Bishop and his work.

Any surplus at parish level is forwarded to the Diocese, which uses these funds to:

- Assist those parishes unable themselves to support their parish clergy.
- Care for those clergy who have now retired.

#### Second Collection

- Used for parish activities including building maintenance, staff, priests' motor vehicle expenses, utility charges, insurance premiums, office costs - indeed, all those type of costs incurred in running a 'business like activity' and ensuring the maintenance and protection of the assets of the Parish



In addition, the Parish pays a levy to the Diocese on the income collected by the Parish.

The Diocese uses this levy income.....

- To assist in operating the Chancery Office in Bathurst, in assisting the Bishop in administering his Diocese and providing a range of services and pastoral ministries including Marriage Tribunal, Youth, Catechist Program, communicating the Mission through the 'Catholic Observer' and Diocesan website and so on;
- For operational costs of the Diocese, including staff, insurance, complying with Government regulations, maintenance of buildings, utility charges etc;
- To support the work of the Catholic Church at the State, National and International levels.

### SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

At various times of the year, the Bishop, on the advice of the Council of Priests, authorises collections for a particular purpose such as Catholic Mission, Caritas, Peter's Pence etc.

Monies collected are used only for the purpose of the collection.

### **A FRANK QUOTE' - EXCERPT FROM POPE FRANCIS' LITTLE BOOK OF WISDOM**

Anyone exercising a role of leadership - allow me to say, anyone whom life has anointed as a leader - needs to have practical goals and to seek specific means to attain them.

At the same time, there is always the risk of disappointment, resentment, and indifference, if our plans and goals do not materialise. Here I would appeal to the dynamic of hope that inspires us to keep pressing on, to employ all our energies and abilities on behalf of those for whom we work, accepting results, making it possible to strike out on new paths, being generous even without apparent results, yet keeping hope alive, with the constancy and courage that comes from accepting a vocation as leader and guide.
